DVN provided **38 TRAININGS** to **659 COMMUNITY** members.




@ WORK educated 440 BUSINESS PROFESSIONALS on how to recognize and respond to domestic violence in the workplace.





DVN hosted the annual **ADVOCATES RETREAT**. The retreat is a day of self care and reflection for advocates who work on the front line with victims every day.




DVN provided 9 BEST PRACTICE TRAININGS to 361 ADVOCATES.





DVN educated **2,276 YOUTH** on the dynamics of teen dating violence, healthy relationships and consent.






DVN provided **TRAINING TO 451 YOUTH WORKERS** on how to recognize and respond to teen dating violence.

2016 - 2018 Strategic Plan

Throughout 2015, the Domestic Violence Network completed a highly collaborative and inclusive strategic planning process to guide the organization's efforts for the next three years. Anchored by a vision to challenge cultural norms about domestic violence in Central Indiana, four key priorities emerged:

1. Strengthen a network that focuses on training, awareness, intervention support, and prevention education to challenge and change cultural norms.

2. Align the Domestic Violence Network's staff and Board roles to strengthen, refine, and expand the Network.

3. Improve internal and external communication to increase understanding of what the Domestic Violence Network does and why it is important.

4. Develop a culture of relationship cultivation with the community to increase revenue and sustainability.
